OVERVIEW: At The Berkeley School, the 4th and 5th co-teacher teaches science and writing curriculum to students in grades 4 and 5, and provides additional support in the 4th and 5th classrooms. This position works closely with the 4th and 5th classroom teachers and reports to the Director of K-8 Teaching and Learning.

Primary Responsibilities

- Support 4th- and 5th-grade classroom teachers in instruction of math, cultural studies, literacy, and other subject areas
- Deliver science and writing instruction to 4th-and 5th-grade students
- Create an instructional environment to meet the diverse intellectual, social, emotional, and physical needs of 4th and 5th-grade students
- Assess and communicate student progress regularly and effectively
- Work in partnership with the Socio-Emotional Learning/Health Teacher and Learning Specialist to support students
- Communicate in partnership with parenting adults and other faculty in support of student growth
- Meet with teaching teams as needed and requested
- Take on a number of supervisory duties, such as lunch or recess
- Perform other duties as assigned by the Director of K-8 Teaching and Learning and the Head of School.
